## **PCS - A School Community for Dyslexia**

The beginning of February marks the beginning of Open Enrollment at PCS. Throughout this flyer you will find evidence of our commitment to our mission; to serve students and families who are affected by DYSLEXIA, and to help students with DYSLEXIA reach their full potential. As an educator, parent, and advocate for children, I do believe that ALL children should receive an education that helps them reach their full potential, however, the programming at PCS is designed specifically for students with language-



based learning challenges such as dyslexia. You will read below how our investment in Structured Language Instruction, led by Dr. Mindy Bramer, has enabled PCS to achieve *Wilson Accredited Training Partner Status*. This type of instruction is truly necessary for students who struggle with dyslexia. The coexistence of dyslexia and ADHD is extremely high and we will continue to sponsor events like Dr. Cheryl Chase who can help us all assist students to develop strategies to be successful despite the presence of dyslexia and ADHD. At PCS, students learn how to use technology to reduce the impact of reading and writing deficits; whether it is the use of speech-to-text to bypass writing

difficulties or the use of digital text readers that allow students to access material above their independent reading level; we help students understand how to use these tools so that they are not hindered by a dyslexic condition. Please read more below about **Bookshare** if you are not familiar with this resource. These are only just a few examples of how we fulfill **our mission** to serve families impacted by **dyslexia**.

As we have grown, I am thankful for the recommendations that you, as our PCS Community, share with your friends, family, and neighbors, but I would ask that you remember our mission when you suggest PCS as an option; and how we are uniquely designed for students with dyslexia!

We are quickly approaching another marker in time - three years removed from March 2020. It is my hope that we can continue to **grow as a school community** post-pandemic. 

# ADHD: What it is & How to Help in the Classroom

ADHD is a **neurological** condition characterized by inattention, distractibility, hyperactivity, and/or impulsivity. According to the CDC, about 6.1 million children have been diagnosed with the condition. Due to the nature of this disorder, students with ADHD are likely to struggle with the **day-to-day expectations of school**, even if they are intelligent and motivated. Tasks such as accurately copying off the board or packing their backpacks for school can be challenging.



Parents of these children often look to teachers for help and guidance. This talk will describe what ADHD is and the ways in which it can impact performance in school, and provide guidelines and concrete strategies that educators and families can use to help support students with ADHD.

# **CURRICULUM, INSTRUCTION & ASSESSMENT**

#### New Curriculum Piloted for Mathematics in Grades 2-8

Provident Charter School is **deeply committed** to providing our students with the necessary remediation of foundational skills coupled with a **rigorous and relevant instructional program** that fully prepares each of them for high school and beyond. In our effort to continue to build and develop partnerships with families, we feel that it is essential to share with you upcoming changes regarding our curriculum. It has been five years since we adopted Ready Mathematics as our Tier 1 math curriculum across all grades. While Ready Mathematics has provided deep opportunities to engage our students in rich mathematics language and discourse, our schoolwide data has consistently indicated gaps in student knowledge in key concepts such as number sense, operational fluency, proportional relationships, and problem-solving. During the 2021-2022 academic year, the **Curriculum Department** in conjunction with

Provident Charter School's math teachers identified **nine criteria** for evaluating potential instructional programs to replace Ready Mathematics including:



- Efficient use of instructional minutes
- Student-friendly materials
- Alignment with PA Standards
- Integrated number sense activities
- Multisensory approaches
- Authentic real-world application through problem-solving
- Systematic spiral review of concepts
- Opportunities for differentiation and remediation
- Resources for families

Throughout the remainder of the year, the Curriculum Department utilized these criteria to evaluate several different instructional programs that had achieved the highest rating on Ed Reports, a non-partisan, independent non-profit that provides quality ratings on curricula. After careful consideration and with consultation from math teachers at Provident Charter School, the Curriculum Department has chosen to move forward with pilots of Eureka Math® in grades 2-5 and Illustrative Math® in grades 6-8. Over the past few months, each of our math teachers has received over 8 hours in professional development focused on the implementation of these new instructional programs. Depending on the grade level, students will participate in our program pilots at different times throughout the remainder of this school year. We are confident that these programs will help us to close gaps in student knowledge and prepare them to be college and career ready. ## **Bookshare Individual Accounts for Students**

#### What is Bookshare®?

Bookshare® is an ebook library that holds more than 1.7 million titles!

#### Who can have access to Bookshare®?

Students who have Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) or 504s that indicate the student has barriers to accessing printed text receive inschool access to Bookshare®.



## How can families access Bookshare®?

All students at Provident Charter School that meet the qualifying criteria have organizational memberships. Families have the ability to create an individual membership that is linked with the organizational membership so that students can add additional books that they would like to read or listen to. When students are promoted in eighth grade or transition to their school of choice earlier, organizational memberships are terminated.

## How can my child obtain an individual membership?

In the last few weeks, emails and hard copy letters were shared with the families of all our qualifying students that contained active links to create individual memberships. If your student meets the qualifying criteria and you didn't receive an email or hard copy letter, please reach out to

curriculum@providentcharterschool.org.


#### **Linking Organizational and Individual Memberships:**
