CURRICULUM CORNER

We have may exciting learning experiences happening this year! Our students in second grade through fifth grade are exploring math concepts with our new math curriculum, Eureka Squared. Eureka Squared focuses on building mastery of concepts over time through productive struggle, rather than in a single lesson. Look for the family math newsletters that come home every 1-2 weeks. If you do any of the home activities, share pictures with your child's teacher on ClassTag!



Are your eighth-grade students looking at food labels more frequently? That's because they are reading *Omnivore's Dilemma*, an anchor text that provides an indepth look at what we eat and where our food comes from. Take some time to read labels **together as a family** and discuss healthy choices for all three meals!
