About our school

Provident Charter School in Pittsburgh, PA is a publicly funded school designed to address the needs of students with language-based learning differences such as dyslexia. Our students are bright yet struggle with topics such as reading, writing, and sequencing. The school is in its third year with students in Grades 2-6 and will add one grade level each year until the school serves students in Grades 2 to 8 in the fall of 2021. Located on the city's North Side the school currently enrolls 215 students from 36 different districts around Western Pennsylvania. Teachers at Provident are departmentalized as Language Arts & Social Studies or Math & Science teachers. Classes of 12 students are taught in a co-teaching style where two teachers are in the classroom for each subject reducing the student to teacher ratio to 6:1. Teachers must approach learning with creativity and leverage opportunities for multi-sensory instruction. Teachers receive comprehensive training and are provided support throughout the school year in developing multi-sensory approaches to instruction that help our students learn and grow.

Emotional Support Teacher

We are currently seeking an Emotional Support Special Educational Teacher to start teaching on April 1, 2019. The Emotional Support Teacher will develop and implement an effective educational program for students assigned to the ES program. The Emotional Support Teacher will work collaboratively with administrators, teachers, and support staff.

Job Goal

- Develop lesson plans and deliver small group instruction within an emotional support classroom.
- Maintain complaint special educational paperwork including input forms, IEPs, PBSPs, NOREPs, etc.
- Collect and report progress monitoring data
- Collaborate with other teachers, professional staff, and administrators to address instructional and/or classroom issues.
- Respond to a wide range of inquiries from parents or guardians regarding instruction, learning and student progress.

Required Qualifications

- 1. Pennsylvania Teaching certification in special education.
- 2. Excellent communication, leadership, organization, and problem-solving skills.
- 3. Outstanding dependability, initiative, creativity, and decision-making skills.
- 4. Proficient in managing and using data to guide decisions for student programs.

- 5. Knowledge of federal Common Core standards and state special education regulations.
- 6. Ability to secure all relevant and necessary clearances.

Preferred Qualifications

- 1. Demonstrated knowledge of special education instructional techniques.
- 2. Background working with students with emotional or behavioral needs that are an impediment to learning.
- 3. Experience teaching students in an emotional support classroom.
- 4. Experience incorporating multi-sensory instruction in small group settings.
- 6. Knowledge, training or certification in Orton Gillingham approaches to instruction.

Professional Responsibilities

- 1. Prepare thoughtfully tailored lesson plans with clear objectives that incorporate multi-sensory instruction techniques which align with Common Core Standards.
- 2. Organize and lead activities designed to promote physical, mental and social development.
- 3. Adapt teaching methods and instructional techniques to meet students' needs and interests.
- 4. Assess student knowledge through a variety of formal and informal assessment techniques, record results and report as needed.
- 5. Work as a member of a team to design lessons that meet the needs of students.
- 6. Meet with other professionals to address students' needs and progress.
- 7. Establish partnerships with parents and family members to facilitate engaging, meaningful interactions about student growth and development.
- 8. Learn and implement assistive technology as needed.
- 9. Monitor students and maintain safety during non-instructional times (i.e. lunch duty, recess duty).
- 10. Continue to grow professionally through activities such as the study of current professional literature, participation in school professional development sessions as well as local, county, regional, and state meetings and conferences.
- 11. Other responsibilities as assigned by the Principal.
