About our school

Provident Charter School is a recently approved charter school opening in Pittsburgh, PA for the 2016-17 school year. The school was designed specifically to address the needs of students with language-based learning differences such as dyslexia. Our students are bright yet struggle with topics such as reading, writing and sequencing. We expect to open the 2016-17 school year with 96 students in Grades 3-4 and will grow to a comprehensive school serving Grades 2-8 by fall 2021.

Teaching at PCS

Each class reaches capacity at 24 students and we will have 4 teachers assigned per class, providing a true 6:1 student-teacher ratio for classroom instruction. Students will be grouped by ability level so that teachers work within a tight scope of ability and can tailor instruction appropriately. Teachers will be departmentalized and will focus on either Language Arts & Social Studies course work or Math & Science. Teachers will loop with students for 2 years in order to minimize transitions and retain positive relationships.

We are currently seeking 16 classroom teachers for Grades 3-4 who are interested in approaching learning with creativity and who will seek out and leverage opportunities for students to learn in both traditional and non-traditional ways. Teachers will receive comprehensive training, work with peer groups and be provided support throughout the school year in developing multi-sensory approaches to instruction that help our students learn and grow.

Job Goal

- Develop lesson plans and deliver small group instruction within established curriculum guidelines.
- Collaborate with other teachers, professional staff, and administrators to address instructional and/or classroom issues.
- Respond to a wide range of inquiries from parents or guardians regarding instruction, learning and student progress.

Required Qualifications

- 1. Pennsylvania Teaching certification (Elementary K-6 or Grades PK-4).
- 2. Excellent communication, leadership, organization and problem-solving skills.
- 3. Outstanding dependability, initiative, creativity and decision-making skills
- 4. Proficient in managing and using data to guide decisions for student programs.

- 5. Knowledge of federal Common Core standards and state special education regulations.
- 6. Ability to secure all relevant and necessary clearances.

Preferred Qualifications

- 1. Demonstrated knowledge of special education instructional techniques.
- 2. Knowledge, training or certification in Orton Gillingham approaches to instruction.
- 3. Experience incorporating multi-sensory instruction in small group settings.
- 4. Experience teaching students with dyslexia.

Professional Responsibilities

- 1. Prepare thoughtfully tailored lesson plans with clear objectives that incorporate multi-sensory instruction techniques which align with Common Core Standards.
- Orchestrate learning with a balanced approach to instruction, demonstration, student
 engagement and work time to provide students with opportunities to observe, question,
 investigate and explore.
- 3. Organize and lead activities designed to promote physical, mental and social development.
- 4. Adapt teaching methods and instructional techniques to meet students' needs and interests.
- 5. Assess student knowledge through a variety of formal and informal assessment techniques, record results and report as needed.
- 6. Work as a member of a team to design lessons that meet the needs of students.
- 7. Meet with other professionals to address students' needs and progress.
- 8. Establish partnerships with parents and family members to facilitate engaging, meaningful interactions about student growth and development.
- 9. Learn and implement assistive technology as needed.
- 10. Monitor students and maintain safety during non-instructional times (i.e. lunch duty, recess duty).
- 11. Continue to grow professionally through activities such as study of current professional literature, participation in school professional development sessions as well as local, county, regional, and state meetings and conferences.
- 12. Other responsibilities as assigned by the Principal.
