About our school

Provident Charter School is a tuition-free approved charter school in Pittsburgh, PA that was designed to address the needs of students diagnosed with dyslexia. The school opened in August 2016 for students in Grades 3 and Grade 4 and currently enrolls 67 students from over 25 school districts in Western Pennsylvania. Parents and guardians have been amazingly pleased to have a school remediating dyslexia and addressing homework during the school day, allowing them to focus on having a well-balanced life with their child. PCS will expand to serve students in Grades 3, 4 & 5 in 2017-18 and expansion will continue through fall 2021 when the school reaches capacity serving Grades 2 through 8.

Teaching at PCS

Each class reaches capacity at 24 students. We are currently seeking an Art Instructor to teach one section per day from 8:30-9:30am. The Art Instructor must be interested in approaching learning with creativity and who will seek out and leverage opportunities for students to learn in both traditional and non-traditional ways. Preference will be given to applicants with experience leading children in a "maker" learning environment.

This is currently a part-time position which requires teaching up to 4 days a week from 8:30-9:30am. As the school grows in the years ahead this will become a full-time position.

Job Goal

- Develop and implement creative lesson plans that truly engage students.
- Collaborate with other teachers, professional staff, and administrators to address instructional and/or classroom issues.
- Respond to a wide range of inquiries from parents or guardians regarding instruction, learning and student progress.

Required Qualifications

- 1. At least three years of experience teaching art.
- 2. Excellent communication, leadership, organization and problem-solving skills.
- 3. Outstanding dependability, initiative, creativity and decision-making skills
- 4. Proficient in managing and using data to guide decisions for student programs.
- 5. Ability to secure all relevant and necessary clearances.

Preferred Qualifications

- 1. Pennsylvania Teaching certification (Art K-12).
- 2. Demonstrated knowledge of instructional techniques.
- 3. Experience incorporating multi-sensory instruction in small group settings.
- 4. Experience leading children in a "maker" learning environment.
- 5. Experience teaching students with dyslexia.

Professional Responsibilities

- 1. Prepare thoughtfully tailored lesson plans with clear objectives that incorporate multi-sensory instruction techniques.
- 2. Orchestrate learning with a balanced approach to instruction, demonstration, student engagement and work time to provide students with opportunities to observe, question, investigate and explore.
- 3. Organize and lead activities designed to promote physical, mental and social development.
- 4. Adapt teaching methods and instructional techniques to meet students' needs and interests.
- 5. Assess student knowledge through a variety of formal and informal assessment techniques, record results and report as needed.
- 6. Meet with other professionals to address students' needs and progress.
- 7. Establish partnerships with parents and family members to facilitate engaging, meaningful interactions about student growth and development.
- 8. Learn and implement assistive technology as needed.
- 9. Other responsibilities as assigned by the Principal.

Terms of Employment: Ten (10) month position.

Evaluation: Performance of this job will be evaluated by the Principal & CEO.

Salary: Stipend of \$2,200 (January to June)
