Makerspace


Math

Students successfully completed the

Classroom Diagnostic Tools (CDT) Assessment in Reading and Writing. This adaptive assessment helps teachers to pinpoint exactly where students are in their learning progression of skills and concepts related to informational text, literature, vocabulary, conventions, and writing structure and style. Teachers will begin reviewing this new assessment platform over the next few months to develop a deeper understanding of students' strengths and areas of improvement. This month our ELA teachers began Module 1 of our new curriculum, Expeditionary Learning Education. Students are reading books and learning about diverse topics ranging from schools and communities in second grade to stories of human rights in fifth grade and folklore of Latin America in eighth grade.


Students completed their i-Ready Math Diagnostic and teachers are digging into the data in order to best meet our students' needs. Over the next few weeks, math teachers will be sharing data with their students, setting goals, and establishing action plans. The curriculum department collaborated with teachers over the summer to build extensive manipulative kits for every math classroom at PCS! These kits contain a variety of high-quality, hands-on learning materials designed to deliver multisensory mathematics instruction to all our students. We are excited to see our teachers incorporate these materials throughout their instruction.

We are excited to share that an application for our second location is underway! More information to come regarding **PCS West**, located in Beaver County!




