Provident Charter School Standards Based Grading 2021-2022 Academic Year

Standards-Based Grading

November 23rd ended our first trimester of the 2021-2022 school year here at PCS, and with that came the release of report cards. If you are new to our school this year, you may have noticed that we utilize a **Standards-Based Report Card**. One of the biggest differences between a Standards-Based Report Card and a traditional report card is the use of "descriptors" as opposed to letter grades.These are meant to describe your child's progress toward meeting the standard.

Standards Based Grading Video

English Language Arts



Our English language arts classes are beginning their next learning expeditions for our ELA curriculum, Expeditionary Learning.

In second grade, students are taking on the role of **paleontologists** and exploring how fossils tell of Earth's changes.

Our third grade students are entering the wild world of frogs and will be learning about the **amazing adaptations** of different reptiles and amphibians.

Our fourth grade students will be exploring animal **defense mechanisms** and animal behavior.

The **hidden world of rainforests** will be the learning focus for our fifth grade students as they learn the vast range of biodiversity that can be found in the rainforest biome.

Learning about **perseverance** in the face of adversity and challenges around the world, our sixth graders will dive into a unit focused around the novel, *The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind* by William Kamkwamba and Bryan Mealer.

Seventh grade students will investigate the relevant topic of **epidemics**, while comparing the behavior associated with medical and social epidemics.

Finally, our eighth grade students will be embarking on a **historical expedition** to listen to various voices of the Holocaust. They will tackle the 1960 memoir of Elie Wiesel, *Night*, and the graphic novel, *Maus and I*, by Art Spiegelman.

THE BOY DHO HAR DESSED THE WIND THE WIND

Science Grades 6-8

Our middle school science classes are continuing on their **investigative journeys** through our new curriculum, Amplify Science.

In sixth grade, students are wrapping up their investigation into the world of spider inheritance and recently created spider offspring that represented the **inherited traits** of the spider parents. Students learned that specific proteins were linked with displayed genetic traits.

The world of **rock formation** and transformation serves as the backdrop for our seventh grade students as they learn about how matter cycling on earth is driven by energy. Students will be exploring the geologic history of two regions in order to account for the region's similarities.

Our eighth grade students are about to enter their first **engineering internship**, applying what they learned in their force and motion unit. Students will design pods that will be dropped from helicopters to provide aid in disaster regions.
